To ask questions about quantity we use:

How much...? How many...?

We use *much* with singular (uncountable) nouns:

A *How much food is there?*

A *How much milk do you want?*

B *There are two hamburgers and a pizza.*

B *Two cartons, please.*

We use *many* with plurals:

A *How many CDs have you got?*

A *How many days are there in a year?*

B *I've got fifty CDs.*

B *There are 365.*

Note!

We use *How much...?* to ask about the price of singular and plural nouns.

A *How much is the yellow dress?*

A *How much are the trainers?*

B *It's £45.*

B *They're £59.99.*
