caressing : cause (someone) to find something funny; entertain; provide interesting and enjoyable occupation for (someone).

double dealing : treating with tokens of fondness, affection, or kindness; cherishing; gently touching, patting, or stroking a person or thing to show affection.

deceive : to persuade someone that something false is the truth; trick or fool

guess : estimate or suppose (something) without sufficient information to be sure of being correct.
