The world is controlled centrally, following a nine-year war between super powers which led to economic collapse. There is total social stability. World population is maintained at two thousand million. English is the only language, all others are dead. There is no religion. History and literature are censored.

Everyone is happy. Babies are born in test-tubes, and by careful use of chemicals and conditioning (babies are taught in their sleep), people are designed to perform certain functions in life. There are five classes of people. There is no illness or disease, but there is also no emotion or privacy. Everyone looks young until they are sixty, when they are sent to hospital to die.

People go to the feelies, where they not only see pictures, but also feel and smell them. There is no love or marriage. Everyone takes a drug called soma, in the evenings with friends and for sleep holidays that last two weeks.
