PRESENT CONTINUOUS: Present vs. Future

The **PRESENT CONTINUOUS** can be used to talk about the present or the future. Look at the *time* expression that is used and this will usually tell WHEN something is happening.

	Time Expressions	Examples
Now	now, right now, currently, at the moment, etc.	I am working now.
Future	tonight, after, later, tomorrow, this (morning), on (Friday), next (year), in (2022)	I am working tomorrow.
