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ON THE SAME WAVELENGTH

to agree, to believe or act in the same way

Example: I'm relieved to hear that we're on the same wavelength about this problem.

Apple of your eye

Meaning:
The person who you love most.

Harry was his first child and the apple of his eye.

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Go with the flow

Meaning:
To accept things as they happen and do what everyone else wants to do.

Don't always try to be different. Go with the flow sometimes.

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LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON

Meaning:
SONS ARE VERY SIMILAR TO THEIR FATHERS

MY FATHER IS A DOCTOR, I AM A DOCTOR, AND MY SON IS IN MEDICAL SCHOOL. LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON.

GET ON WITH

DEFINITION: to have a friendly relationship with someone

Get along with is an inseparable phrasal verb. This means that the object cannot be placed in between the verb and (person)/object.

✓ My friends get along with each other.
✗ My friends get on together along with.
✗ My friends get along someone with.

EXAMPLE: Even though my friends are different, we all get on with each other, and get along with each other and each other.

Build Bridges

to help two people, groups, or countries who have disagreed to have a more friendly relationship
