



Reflexive or Intensive Pronoun?

Reflexive and Intensive pronouns have identical forms but serve different functions in a sentence.

Reflexive and Intensive Pronouns

Singular: myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself

Plural: ourselves, themselves, yourselves



Reflexive pronouns: These pronouns reflect the subject of the sentence. Use reflexive pronouns when the subject and the object are the same. If you remove the reflexive pronoun from a sentence, the sentence will no longer make sense.

Example: My older brother watched **himself** in the mirror.

Intensive pronouns: These pronouns are mainly for emphasis. You can remove an intensive pronoun from a sentence, and the sentence still makes sense.

Example: Andrew made a triple-tiered chocolate cake **himself**.
