They are jumping, jumping with Ted.

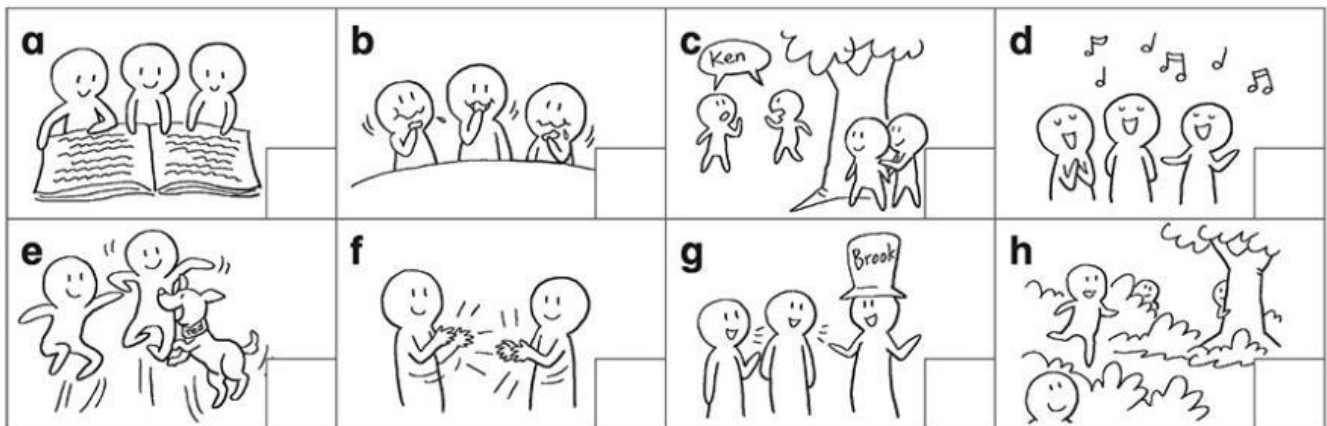
④ What are you doing, doing, doing?
