



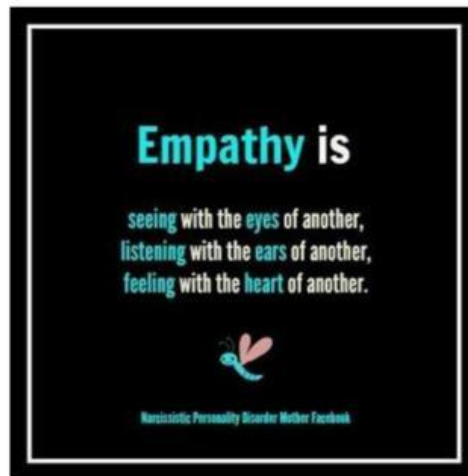

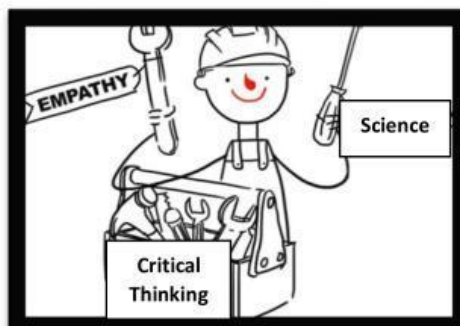
Part I: Vocabulary
