

KEEP AS PHRASAL VERB

Keep in

(no allow someone out)

- 1.- Policemen suggested keeping ourselves in until they find the thieves
- 2.- It has been snowing since yesterday. That is why we will keep ourselves in today.

Keep from

(to not do)

- 1.-He has been very clumsy She found it hard to *keep from* laughing.
- 2.- It's difficult to *keep from* worrying about this situation.

Keep Down

(no vomit)

- 1.-After the party I could not keep myself down.
- 2.-I could not keep it down after getting off the roller coaster.

Keep Away from

(avoid someone or something)

- 1.-He keeps away from the garden. He has a lot of allergies.

2.-The next-door Neighbor does not like Dogs. You must keep your dog away from his house.

Keep around

(something/one near)

1.-I Keep a dictionary around when reading Spanish books.

2.- Susan keeps her asma pills around when she travels abroad.

Keep on

(to continue)

1.- She *kept on* talking after I told her to be quiet.

2.- The rain *kept on* throughout the day.
