#### What is a process paragraph?

- A process paragraph is a series of steps that explain how something happens or how to make something. For example: how to make tea, how to improve your English, or how to give a successful presentation.
- In the subsequent discussion, the topic of delivering a successful presentation will be used to illustrate the principles of composing a process paragraph.
- **A process paragraph usually has three important parts:**
  1. Topic sentence
  2. Steps to complete the process
  3. Conclusion sentence
- **Topic sentence tells the reader what you will explain or what directions you will give.**  
For example:  
*If you want to give a successful presentation, make sure you follow these steps.*
