

## Zero Conditional Form

### If + Present Tense, Present Simple

For example: If I **speak** (speak) to John, he **gets** (get) annoyed.

- 1) If I \_\_\_\_\_ (wake up) late, I \_\_\_\_\_ (be) late for work.
- 2) If my husband \_\_\_\_\_ (cook) , he \_\_\_\_\_ (burn) the food.
- 3) If Julie \_\_\_\_\_ (not/wear) a hat, she \_\_\_\_\_ (get) sunstroke.
- 4) If children \_\_\_\_\_ (not/eat) well, they \_\_\_\_\_ (not/be) healthy.
- 5) If you \_\_\_\_\_ (mix) water and electricity, you \_\_\_\_\_ (get) a shock.

## First Conditional Form

### If + Present Tense, S + will + V.1

### If + Present Tense, S + V. modal+ V.1

For example: She **ll stay** (stay) in London if she **get** (get) a job.

- 1) If I \_\_\_\_\_ (go) out tonight, I \_\_\_\_\_ (go) to the cinema.
- 2) If you \_\_\_\_\_ (get) back late, I \_\_\_\_\_ (be) angry.
- 3) If we \_\_\_\_\_ (not/see) each other tomorrow, we \_\_\_\_\_ (see) each other next week.
- 4) If he \_\_\_\_\_ (come) , I \_\_\_\_\_ (be) surprised.
- 5) If we \_\_\_\_\_ (wait) here, we \_\_\_\_\_ (be) late.
- 6) If we \_\_\_\_\_ (go) on holiday this summer, we \_\_\_\_\_ (go) to Spain.

7) If the weather \_\_\_\_\_ (not/improve) , we \_\_\_\_\_ (not/have) a picnic.

8) If I \_\_\_\_\_ (not/go) to bed early, I \_\_\_\_\_ (be) tired tomorrow.

9) If we \_\_\_\_\_ (eat) all this cake, we \_\_\_\_\_ (feel) sick.

10) If you \_\_\_\_\_ (not/want) to go out, I \_\_\_\_\_ (cook) dinner at home.

### Second Conditional Form

If + Past Tense, S + would + V.1

For example: She 'd be (be) happier if she had (have) more friends.

1) If I \_\_\_\_\_ (be) you, I \_\_\_\_\_ (get) a new job.

3) If we \_\_\_\_\_ (not/be) friends, I \_\_\_\_\_ (be) angry with you.

4) If I \_\_\_\_\_ (have) enough money, I \_\_\_\_\_ (buy) a big house.

5) If she \_\_\_\_\_ (not/be) always so late, she \_\_\_\_\_ (be) promoted.

6) If we \_\_\_\_\_ (win) the lottery, we \_\_\_\_\_ (travel) the world.

7) If you \_\_\_\_\_ (have) a better job, we \_\_\_\_\_ (be) able to buy a new car.

8) If I \_\_\_\_\_ (speak) perfect English, I \_\_\_\_\_ (have) a good job.

9) If we \_\_\_\_\_ (live) in Mexico, I \_\_\_\_\_ (speak) Spanish.

10) If she \_\_\_\_\_ (pass) the exam, she \_\_\_\_\_ (be) able to enter university.
