

WILL

We use the **Future - will**:

- **To talk about the future;**
Ex: Tomorrow I **will visit** my grandparents.

- **To make predictions**
Ex: I think it **will rain** tomorrow

- **Requests;**
Ex: **Will** you **help** me with my house chores, please?

- **Intentions.** To talk about something we have just decided at the moment of speaking.
Ex: I am so tired. I think I **will** go to bed earlier.

Note: In the **affirmative** form we can use either **I will** or **I'll**.

In the **negative** form we can use either the form **I will not** or **I won't**

GOING TO

PLANS

You can use **be going to + infinitive** to talk about future plans. It expresses an intention, decision which has already been made.

e.g. : *I am going to tell him this evening.*
She isn't going to work there..
Are you going to read the book ?

PRESENT EVIDENCE

You can also use **be going to + infinitive** to predict future from present evidence. The future event is on the way.

e.g. : *Look at the clouds. It's going to rain !*
Look at the boy. He's going to fall.

PRESENT CONTINUOUS

We usually use the present continuous when the plan is an arrangement – already confirmed with at least one other person and we know the time and place.

- I'm meeting Jane at 8 o'clock on Saturday.
- We're having a party next Saturday.
