
Natural Resources

Natural resources are materials found in the environment that are useful to humans.

Natural Resources can be grouped as renewable and nonrenewable.

Renewable resources can be replaced or used over and over. Soil, air, water, and trees are renewable resources.

Non-renewable resources cannot be replaced easily or reused. Fossil fuels such as oil, coal and natural gas are examples of non-renewable resources.





Resources can be biodegradable, which means that it can be decomposed or broken down easily such as trees, paper, animals or fruits.

Resources can also be non-biodegradable, which means that it cannot be decomposed or broken down easily such as plastic products and Styrofoam.
