HOW TO START CROWDFUNDING

Crowdfunding is changing the way that businesses work and the way individuals can set up companies. It's a way of funding a specific project by raising donations, usually for a limited period of time.

In a world where we are bombarded with information, great crowdfunding ideas need to be creative and bold to stand out from the rest. Crowdfunding is competitive, so you need to prepare before you start.

Some key pointers for crowdfunding:

- **Choose your project.** Know what you want to achieve and why. It's important to have this very clear before starting.
- **Make a budget.** Decided how much money you want to raise. Remember that in addition to money, people can also donate their time and skills.
- **Know who your audience is.** Who do you want to pay attention to this project? Think about what you have to offer.
- **Prepare your promotion.** Be creative and make it fun. Ideas are much more motivating to people when they enjoy them. Use your creativity to think of ideas that will inspire. A board game competition is a fun and friendly way to bring people together. It offers competition as well as team-building for a good cause. Or maybe a skills workshop. Invite people to come and learn a new skill.
- **Create a great project page.** Make it dynamic. Use video, images, and text.
- **Choose the best platform.** Do some research. There are many platforms out there, so choose one that works for you.
- **Keep communication going.** Update your funders on the progress of your fundraiser.
