The Golestan Palace in Tehran

[1] When we talk about Tehran, we mainly talk about a historical city of Iran that developed mainly during the Safavid reign. Initially, the town of Tehran had fortifications with four gates, 114 towers and five neighborhoods that went by the names: Udlajan, Sangelaj, Chaleh Meydan, Bazaar and Arg which served as a governmental quarter. The most ancient part of the Arg (Golestan Palace) is Golestan garden which depicts the Persian Garden style and is in compatibility with the characteristics of the **terrain** and its weather. Under Zand dynasty, the Golestan garden was under some special protection but it only became the governmental center and political capital of Iran under Qajar dynasty around 1785 AD for its position which provides strategic, geographical and defensive advantages.

[2] Precisely, the Golestan Palace which served as the residence and governing base of Qajar kings was located to the north of the garden. At that time, only two Qajar compounds existed that were used as residences for the crown prince and Qajar kings.

[3] We can say that the Golestan Palace is an influential and prominent structure from social, political and cultural points of view. It represents an entity dating back to the Safavid period through Zand and Qajar eras to Pahlavi rule all up to date.

[4] The Golestan palace's role actually didn't stop at being a governmental and/or residential compound, but also extends that to being a center for artistic works in addition to being the origin of the architectural school of Qajar in Iran and the entire world. In fact, the Golestan Palace is considered as the first studio for films and photography in Iran as well as a meeting place for artists of that time. It represents a rich variety and combinations of both Iranian and western heritages that works as an attracting factor today for visitors of Iran coming from all over the world.
