

**Reading:****The Golestan Palace - Tehran**

The city of *Tehran* was one of the residences of the *Safavid* dynasty in the 16<sup>th</sup> century, and the first defensive walls were built at that time. Speaking of the *Golestan Palace*, it could be said that it closely follows the history of the city of Tehran.

The *Arg* (500\*800m) was part of the northern section of the old town. Sometime during the *Zand* dynasty, the *Arg* underwent some renovation works to which *Divan Khaneh* was built. *Divan Khaneh* which is the first part of the *Golestan Palace* was constructed in the existing Persian garden from the *Safavid* period. With the *Qajar* family coming to power in 1785, they chose *Tehran* as the Capital of the country, and the *Golestan Palace* as the seat of government.

The city of *Tehran* maintained its traditional form until the 19<sup>th</sup> century before *Qajar* kings decided that it was time for some renovation processes. At that time, *Qajar* kings had ideas of modernization and strengthening of the country as well as the political status. Aiming to do so, they managed to dig in western models and integrate them with Persian ones in their efforts to make the new architecture and planning policies.

As part of the wider renovation process, the *Golestan Palace* had to undergo some renovation works. In 1874, the main building of the palace was completed and the separated traditional gardens were integrated into one garden. The new unified garden is exactly the same one that was joined with the western part, forming the *Golestan Palace* we know today. The rest of the old *Arg* was replaced over time by governmental buildings.

As an influential monument of Tehran, the *Golestan Palace* consists of 17 buildings including palaces, halls and museums surrounding the large garden layout. They are different in ages and are richly ornate with marbles, mirror works, tile works with illustrations, motifs and paintings. The artistry work in the Palace reflects a considerable variety of historic, cultural and natural themes.
