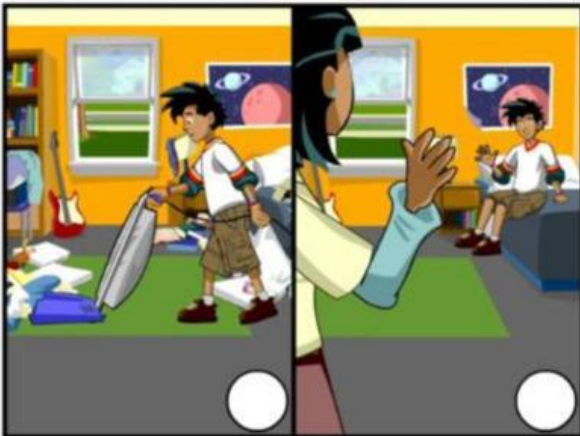
WRITTEN PRODUCTION:
