#### **HOW ARE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF COMMONS CHOSEN IN THE UNITED KINGDOM**

Members of the House of Commons are commonly known as MPs.

1.2. \_\_\_\_\_ which the United Kingdom is divided. With  
a 1.3. \_\_\_\_\_ exceptions, all those over 18 may vote in Parliamentary  
elections, 1.4. \_\_\_\_\_ that they are citizens of 1.5. \_\_\_\_\_ the United  
Kingdom or the Irish Republic. Nobody can vote 1.6. \_\_\_\_\_ they are  
registered as an elector. A form is sent to each household every autumn  
1.7. \_\_\_\_\_ that anyone who is old 1.8. \_\_\_\_\_ has a chance to  
register. Everybody has one vote, 1.9. \_\_\_\_\_ they do not have to  
use it. There are two types of Parliamentary elections. A general election is

Stay calm. A computer virus isn't dangerous **2.1.** \_\_\_\_\_ the infected email is opened. Delete any mail you think is infected and empty your deleted items folder. Read the email. Check whether what the message is about **2.2.** \_\_\_\_\_ sense before you open any attachments. Look out **2.3.** \_\_\_\_\_ hoaxes. There are many emails warning of "the most destructive virus ever", but often **2.4.** \_\_\_\_\_ viruses don't exist. Send any email you think is infected **2.5.** \_\_\_\_\_ an anti-virus company (you may have to own a copy of their virus software). They can tell you **2.6.** \_\_\_\_\_ it is a virus or not. Make **2.7.** \_\_\_\_\_ you have a recent backup of your most important work. If you get a computer virus you'll need to use a virus scanner to get **2.8.** \_\_\_\_\_ of it. Don't open any attachment you are not sure about, **2.9.** \_\_\_\_\_ if you have a virus scanner. Don't forward any attachments to a friend **2.10.** \_\_\_\_\_ being sure it is safe. Don't send mail that may contain a virus to anyone **2.11.** \_\_\_\_\_ than official virus companies. Mail filtering systems will probably delete it anyway. Don't disregard viruses **2.12.** \_\_\_\_\_ because you have a virus scanner! You will still need to keep your eyes open in **2.13.** \_\_\_\_\_ a new virus emerges.
