PAST PERFECT

We use the Past Perfect when we mention two events in the past and we need to emphasize the order. Look at the timeline.



When I turned on the TV, the movie had already finished.

Event in the past

Event in the past

Present

PAST PERFECT SIMPLE PAST

1st event: the movie finished

2nd event: I turned on the TV

Consequence: I missed the movie, that's why I'm disappointed.

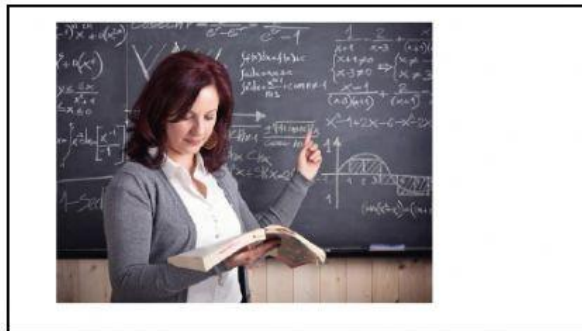
