/d/	If the verb ends in a vowel sound or a voiced consonant (l, n, r, b, g, m, z, s, v), then the -ed ending sounds like a /d/ and does not create a new syllable.	Cleaned
/t/	If the verb ends in an unvoiced consonant (p, k, f, gh, sh, ch, ss, c, x), then the -ed ending sounds like a /t/ and does not create a new syllable.	laughed
