Community Gardens

People who live in the center of a town or city often don't have a garden, or if they do, it might be very small. For people who can't grow their own fruit and vegetables, a community garden is a great place.

A community garden is a garden which is used by a lot of different people who live near each other. People work together to grow fruit and vegetables, which are for all the people who use the garden. Sometimes community gardens are in villages and sometimes they are in cities.

In the USA, American people started making community gardens in the 19th century. They planted fruit and vegetables in places between buildings and in school gardens. It was the perfect way to use empty land and they saved a lot of money. During the Second World War Americans grew 40% of their own food!

Community gardens are fun and people enjoy them. People who live in apartments in cities sometimes don't know their neighbors. Sometimes old people are lonely because they have nobody to talk to. In a community garden people meet their neighbors and they talk. Usually people of all ages use the garden, and this can help children learn about where lettuce, potatoes and tomatoes come from.
