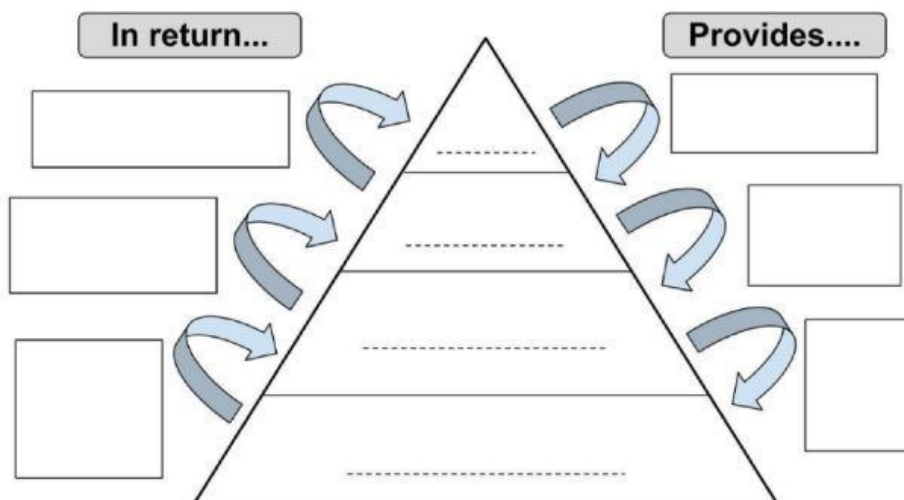
4. What was the feudal system?

Feudalism was a system of government in which people vote their elected representatives into parliament.

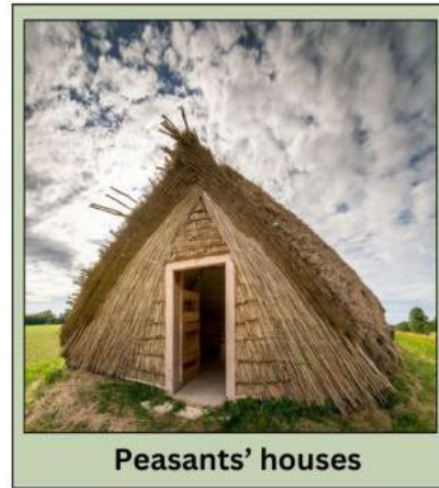
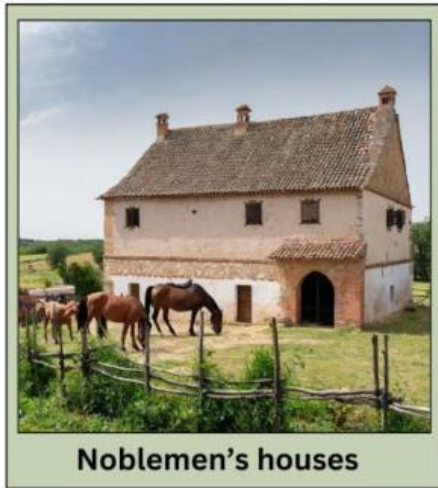
