Digital nomads

The word "nomad", at least for me, gives an idea of a romantic, artistic person who wanders around the world with no cares in the world, constantly looking for wisdom.

But what about digital nomads? Who are they and what do they do?

Digital nomad is a new type of career. They are individuals who work freelance and only need a laptop or tablet and good Wi-Fi. Digital nomads don't need to work in just one location and can do their jobs from anywhere in the world.

There are many types of jobs that can be done as a digital nomad, such as web design, journalism, social media management, writing, and on-line marketing. With a job market that is changing rapidly, more and more jobs can be done as a freelancer.

Working freelance can be lonely, and most digital nomads benefit from forming freelance groups or belonging to a community. Freelance "centers" have developed in places like Canggu in Bali or Ho Chi Minh City in Vietnam. In these places, groups of digital nomads have established connections. They often share working spaces or gather together in cafés.

Being a digital nomad is not an ideal profession for everybody. A lack of routine, little contact with others, or not feeling part of a team may feel isolating for some. But for others, being a digital nomad in a growing digital age is the perfect fit.

Bilingualism

People who are raised in a bilingual family may not be aware of the advantages of being bilingual. In a household where more than one language is spoken on a regular basis, children grow up having more than one native language. From an early age, bilingual children are known to switch easily from one language to another, to start a sentence in one language and to finish in another, to interchange words, and even to invent words.

Research shows that being able to speak two languages fluently has a positive effect on the brain. The ability to speak two languages simultaneously exercises the brain and has cognitive benefits.

Another positive effect of bilingualism is that people can multi-task more effectively. The ability to switch between two languages helps them to be able to juggle different tasks at the same time. This is a useful life skill to have.

Bilingual people have an advantage over monolingual people when looking for a job. Most employers consider speaking two languages as better than one. And some experts say that there are health benefits associated with being bilingual. It is known to delay the onset of dementia and Alzheimer's.

Bilingual people may not always see their skills as positive. They may frequently confuse words between the two languages, or they don't feel they belong to any one culture. As parents, they may worry that their bilingual children will start to speak later than normal.
