

Teen jobs

Many British and American teenagers aged between 14 and 19 years old have a part-time job. They do all kinds of jobs. Some of them sell things in shops, others work in bars, cafés or restaurants. They babysit, walk their neighbours dogs or even give a hand in farms.

It is quite common for American and British teenagers to have a job. In fact, around 25% of them have one. And they are legally protected. There are laws regulating teenage work.

For example, in the UK, 13 to 15 year olds can't work in a factory and they can only work from 7 am to 7 pm. While they are studying, they cannot work more than two hours a day during weekdays and on Sundays. However, they can work up to five hours on Saturday but no more than twelve hours a week as a whole.

During holidays, they can work from 7am to 11pm. There is no difference between weekdays and weekends but they cannot work more than five hours a day and they are allowed to work up to 25 hours a week as a whole.

-Many students have a part-time job in Japan. It is quite common. They can buy their own things and develop a sense of responsibility-. (Takashi, 17. Japan)

-I think teenagers mustn't work during the academic year. But, it is good to have work experience during the summer-. (Sarah, 15. Australia)
