

Sea of Light Diamond

(In Persian: Daria-i-Noor)



The Sea of Light diamond is considered as one of the largest cut diamonds in the world weighing around 182 carats (36 g). It was mined around 1000 years ago in Kollur mine in India and maybe was cut from a larger stone.

It's believed that it was originally owned by the Kakatiya dynasty and later became part of Shah Jahan's Peacock Throne. In 1739, it was brought to Persia as part of the collection taken by Nader Shah upon his invasion of Northern India. Over time, it moved from one relative and associate of Nader Shah to another until reaching the Zand ruler Karim Khan.

The Sea of Light Diamond still remains as part of the Iranian Crown Jewels currently residing in the Iranian Central Bank in Tehran.
