

SIMPLE PAST TENSE



We can use the **past simple** to talk about things we did in the past.
 The past simple ending is **-ed** for regular verbs:
 play – played, watch – watched, want – wanted
 Irregular verbs have a special form:
 eat – ate, write – wrote, go – went
 For the negative, don't change the main verb. Use 'didn't' instead:
 play – didn't play, eat – didn't eat
