Smart phones?

Smart phones are much more than just mobile phones. They work like small computers and have cameras, video cameras, games and apps for just about everything. They are certainly very popular with primary school pupils. We interviewed 200 primary pupils and found that over 50% use a smart phone for more than an hour every 5 day (see Figure 1).

But the news is not all good. Experts are worried that children spend too much time on smart phones and not enough time on studying.





Figure 2: Primary pupils use of smart phones

10 Some pupils say that they use their smart phones for homework, but as Figure 2 shows, these students are not the majority.

Another problem is that smart phones can cause pain in necks, shoulders, fingers and 15 wrists. They can damage young eyes too.

It is impossible to stop children using smart phones. But we must teach them to be smart users — they should use smart phones for useful things and not spend too much time 20 on them.



Figure 1: Amount of time primary pupils spent on smart phones per day
