But we'll all be healthier.

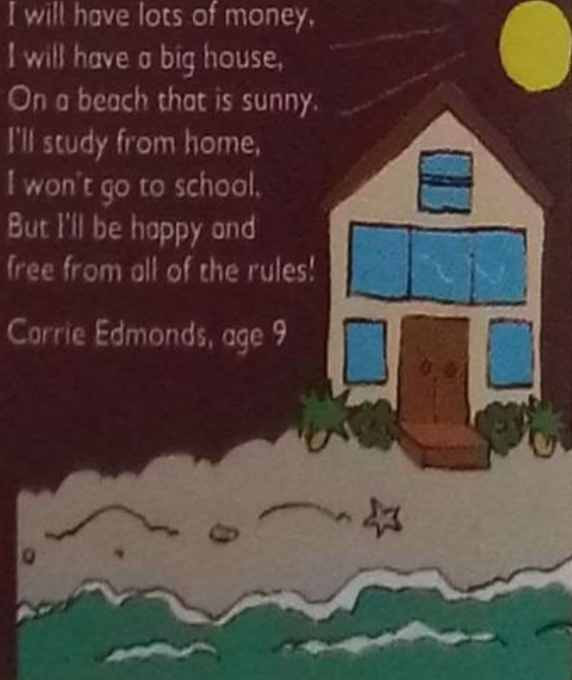
