Task 4: Read the following passage.

Take a look at your neighbor's eyes. The first thing you'll probably notice is the color of their eyes. Most people have brown, blue, or green eyes. Some people may have hazel, gray, or violet eyes. The colored part of the eye is called the **iris**.

Next you'll notice the **pupil**. The pupil is the black circle in the center of the iris. The pupil controls the amount of light that enters the eye. If you're in a very bright room, you'll notice that your neighbor's pupils are very small. This allows only a little bit of light to enter. If you are in a dark space, your neighbor's pupils will be much larger. This allows more light to enter the eye.

The eye is actually shaped like a ball. Eyes sit in a socket in the skull. When light enters the pupil, it hits the back of the eye, called the **retina**. After, the retina sends a visual message to the brain. Finally, when the brain gets the message, vision occurs.
