

## Practice Future Perfect tense

Future II Simple expresses an action that will be finished at a certain time in the future.

### Form

- A: He will have talked.
- N: He will not have talked.
- Q: Will he have talked?

### Use

- action that will be finished at a certain time in the future

### Signal Words

- by Monday, in a week

A: Have you repaired the bike yet?

B: No, I will have repaired it by Monday.
