15 was because I was standing too close to them and they felt uncomfortable. When they are having a conversation, South Americans stand much closer to one another than Germans do. This is true even when the South Americans don't know each other very well.

20 I am studying French in Paris with students from different nations. I found out that there are an amazing number of ways to say "hello" in different cultures. I'm never sure what to do! In England, where I'm from, most people shake hands when they meet. In many countries, like France, people

25 greet each other with a kiss – some people kiss on one cheek or on both cheeks and other people kiss three times!

The Japanese bow when they greet people. My Maori friend, a student from New Zealand, puts his nose to mine when we greet each other. That really surprised me – especially

30 the first time we met! But the greeting that I think is really special is when my friend from Singapore puts her palms⁴ together and then puts her hands over her heart.
