
TRAVELLING BY BUS

 Is a ticket which allows someone to travel to a place and back again.

A transit bus

 is a ticket for a journey from one place to another but not back again.

A fare

 Is a bus typically used within a single metropolitan region (no luxury).

A photocard

is a bus used for longer-distance service.
It is quite luxurius (toilet, fridge).

A seat

 is a card with a person's photograph on it, which they can use to prove who they are.

A single ticket

 part of a bus, <u>train</u>, <u>plane</u>, etc. that has been <u>designed</u> for someone to <u>sit</u> on.

A return ticket

 Is the price of transportation in a bus, train, airplane, or other vehicle.
