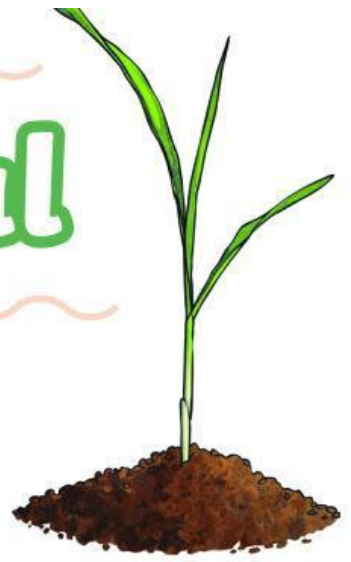


First Conditional



We use the first conditional to talk about things that are possible or are likely to happen.

We use the language structure:

If + **present simple clause** + , + **simple future clause** (will/won't)

"If I **am sick**, I **will take some medicine**."

"If **she saves enough money**, **she will go to Italy**."
