

## Zero Conditional

- Conditionals describe the result of a certain condition.
- The *if-clause* tells you the condition (if I work hard) and the main clause tells you the result (I will take long holidays)
- ★ The order of the clauses does not change the meaning.

### 0 Zero Conditional

👉 We use the zero conditional to talk about things that are generally true, especially for laws and rules.

📍 Examples:

- If I drink too much coffee, I can't sleep at night.
- Ice melts if you heat it.
- When the sun goes down, it gets dark.

✍ Structure

If/when + present simple >> present simple
