Zero Conditional

📌 Conditionals describe the result of a certain condition.

📌 The *if*-clause tells you the condition (if I work hard) and the main clause tells you the result (I will take long holidays)

★ The order of the clauses does not change the meaning.

0 Zero Conditional

👉 We use the zero conditional to talk about things that are generally true, especially for laws and rules.

📌 Examples:

- If I drink too much coffee, I can't sleep at night.
- Ice melts if you heat it.
- When the sun goes down, it gets dark.
