### Grammar *there is/there are, some/any*

#### Singular

Affirmative:

*There's a TV.*  
*There's an armchair.*

Negative:

*There's no sofa.*  
*There's no balcony.*

Questions:

*Is there a washing machine?*  
*Yes, there is.* *No, there's not.* (No, *there isn't.*)

We use *some* and *any* with plural nouns. We use *some* in affirmative sentences when more than one thing or person exists, but we don't say exactly how many.

*There are some chairs in the classroom.*

*There are some new students in our class.*

*I have some books in my bag.*

We use *any* in negative sentences and questions with plural nouns. We use *no* after an affirmative verb and with a singular or plural noun.

*There are no tables. / There aren't any tables.*

*I have no brothers or sisters. / I don't have any brothers or sisters.*

*Are there any shelves in the bedroom?*

*The window is across from the door.*




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
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
