10 Sally : It's OK. Let's eat at my house tomorrow.

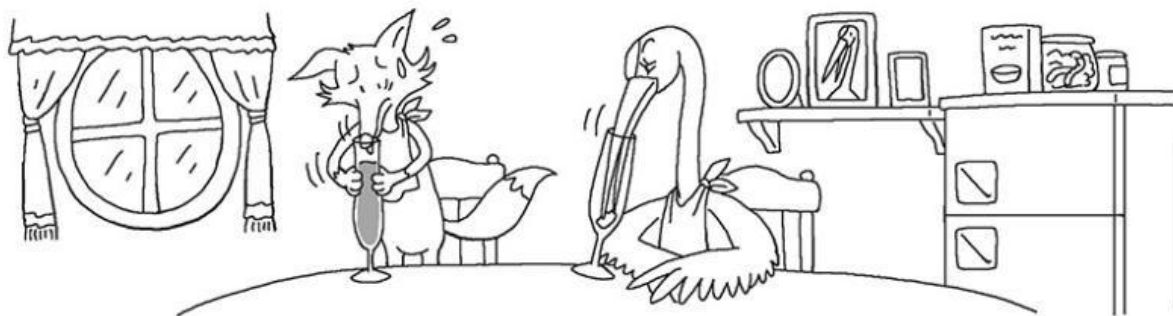


The next day Freddy goes to Sally's place.

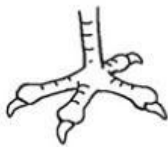
