


Life with Dr. Seuss



Theodore Seuss Geisel was born in 1904. He lived in Springfield, Massachusetts. His father was a zookeeper. When Theodore became an adult, he began to write stories for children. He called himself Dr. Seuss.

Maybe you have read some of Dr. Seuss's books. One of his first books was called *If I Ran the Zoo*. It was based on his own childhood experiences with his father at the zoo.

In the 1950's, Dr. Seuss began writing books that would help children learn to read. The most popular one was *The Cat in the Hat*. Other famous ones were *Green Eggs and Ham* and *Yertle the Turtle*.

Dr. Seuss also won awards for cartoons. These cartoons were called *Gerald McBoing-Boing* and *The Grinch Who Stole Christmas*.

Dr. Seuss lived in La Jolla, California, for much of his life. He wrote many more books and won many awards. The license plate on his car said "GRINCH". But he was not a grinch. He loved children, and children loved his books. Dr. Seuss died in 1991 at the age of 87. His books will live on forever.
