

For Creating and Evaluating the blooms taxonomy:

The Cask of Amontillado

The narrator, Montresor, is consumed by a desire for revenge against his friend Fortunato, whom he believes has wronged him in a thousand ways (though the exact nature of the offenses remains unclear).

Montresor hatches a plan to lure Fortunato deep into his family's catacombs under the pretense of seeking a rare wine called Amontillado.

As they descend deeper, Montresor chains Fortunato to a wall in a recess. He reveals his plan for revenge and proceeds to brick up the alcove, leaving Fortunato to die a slow and agonizing death.

The story ends with Montresor expressing no remorse for his actions, leaving the reader to ponder the depths of his obsession and the horror of his crime.
