An amazing memory

For as long as he can remember, Brad Williams has been able to remember the most useless information and details about his life. His family and friends always find it awesome, but experts and doctors are now studying him to try and find out more about how memory works.

Williams seems to like having his memory tested and when you tell him a random date, he can remember exactly what happened that day. For example, if you say "August 18th, 1965" he will tell you that it was a Wednesday, he was eight years old and he was on a trip with his parents. They stayed at a motel that night, but it was more like a cabin. Williams is in his fifties now, and these events happened over forty years ago.
