Reading 3: It is very difficult to define a culture. Some people say it is the food of a group of people, and others say it is the music they love. These things are important, and they are often very different from culture to culture. But for me, a culture is the normal conversations of people. This is much more important than food and drink.

Before travelling to a new country, most people learn how to say hello and goodbye, and maybe they find out about something like using your right hand to pick up food. But if you get those things wrong, people will just laugh. The first thing to learn is about topics of conversation – what is OK and what is not.

In your own culture, you do not have to worry about someone's meaning most of the time. But in another culture, you must always think, 'What does this person mean?' No. It's just a polite way of ending a conversation.
