MUST or HAVE TO?

MUST	HAVE TO
Is personal. We use it to express personal feelings. It's used for present and future, not for past. <i>"I must go home now" (I say it's necessary)</i>	Is impersonal. We don't use it for feelings, but for facts. It's used in all forms. <i>"I have to tidy my bedroom. My mum wants me to." (Mum says it's necessary)</i>

MUSTN'T	DON'T HAVE TO
It's a prohibition. It's necessary that you do NOT do something. <i>"You mustn't smoke in a hospital"</i>	It expresses lack of necessity. It's not necessary for you to do something. <i>"You don't have to wear a uniform in this school."</i>

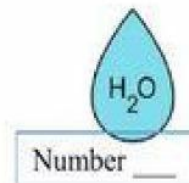
