#### **Sonja Henie - Norwegian Queen of the Ice**

Sonja Henie was the first famous figure skater. Figure skating is a mixture of dance and skating. She was born in Oslo, Norway, in 1912. Her parents were both very wealthy. They encouraged Sonja to play a lot of different sports. She started doing sport when she was three. She tried tennis and really loved it. When she was six, she borrowed her brother's ice skates and loved that even more. She also tried skiing and horse riding, but her family soon realised that skating was the ideal sport for her. The problem was, she didn't have enough time to train every day in skating and dance. Because of this, her parents took her out of school and she was taught at home.

She attended the 1924 Winter Olympics at the age of 11. She came last but between 1928 and 1936 she won three Olympic gold medals in figure skating. She became famous for the short skirt and white skates, which skaters still wear today. These allowed her to jump higher and turn more.

Sonja moved to Hollywood, USA and appeared in several films, including *Sun Valley Serenade* and *Iceland*. They were all romantic comedies. Her first film, *One in a Million*, made Sonja a huge star overnight. In total, she made 13 Hollywood films. At aged 42, she retired, returned to Norway and started collecting modern art with her husband. When she died in 1969, the collection of paintings and sculpture was given to an art museum in her home town of Oslo.
