



1. MUST HAVE DONE / CAN'T HAVE DONE / MIGHT HAVE DONE / SHOULD HAVE DONE

I'm sure that man stole my wallet. → That man MUST HAVE STOLEN my wallet.

I'm not sure if he stole my wallet or not. → He MIGHT HAVE STOLEN my wallet.

2. ALTHOUGH, DESPITE, IN SPITE OF

We went for a walk although it was raining.

Despite the rain, we went for a walk.

Although I was tired, I went to the gym.

I decided to work on this project in spite of being tired.

3. I HAVE BEEN DOING sth FOR/ SINCE

She has been working on this project since March.

My mum has been sleeping for 10 hours.

4. I'D RATHER DO sth

I'd rather you didn't take my things without permission.

I'd rather not learn by heart.

I'd rather not do this exercise today.

5. IT'S HIGH TIME WE / YOU (+ PAST SIMPLE)

It's high time we went shopping. The fridge is empty.

It's high time she broke up with this guy.

6. I WISH

- I regret not buying this dress.
- I wish I had bought this dress.
- I wish my neighbours would stop arguing in the middle of the night.

7. TRYBY WARUNKOWE (CONDITIONALS)

- Suppose you won a lottery, what would you do?
- If she had parked her car in a different place, she wouldn't have got a ticket.

8. THERE'S NO POINT DOING (IN) something

IT'S NO USE DOING something.

It's no use asking her.

- There's no point learning everything by heart.
- There's no point trying to convince her.
- There's no point crying over spilt milk. = It's no use crying over spilt milk.
- There's no point asking her.

9. I'M USED TO DOING something / I GOT USED TO DOING something

- I'm used to getting up at early.
- She got used to going to work by bus.

10. HAVE SOMETHING DONE

- I will have my window fixed tomorrow. – Jutro moje okno zostanie naprawione.
- I'm going to have my essay checked.
- I had my hair cut last week.
