

## EXERCISE 67 – SIMPLE FUTURE TENSE

Fill in the blanks with 'shall' or 'will'. Then write out each sentence.

e.g. I ..... be twelve years old next year.  
I shall be twelve years old **next year**.

- I ..... be in Primary Five **next year**.
- There ..... be a holiday **next Tuesday**.
- He ..... be thirty years old **next June**.
- She ..... be in Primary Four **next year**.
- ..... we all play football **this evening**.
- The baby ..... be three months old **next week**.
- When ..... you be in Singapore again?
- We ..... visit our aunt **tomorrow**.

## EXERCISE 68 – SIMPLE FUTURE TENSE

Put in the Simple Future tense of the verbs in brackets. Use only 'shall' or 'will'.

## EXERCISE 69 – SIMPLE FUTURE TENSE

Make these sentences negative by putting in 'not'.

e.g. I shall be in Hong Kong tonight.  
I shall **not** be in Hong Kong tonight.

- I shall wait for you **this evening**. I shall **not** wait for you **this morning**.
- I shall bring my pet to school. I shall **not** bring my pet to school.
- We shall wait for him after school. We shall **not** wait for him after school.
- She will go to church **this Sunday**. She will **not** go to church **this Sunday**.
- They will do well in the examination. They will **not** do well in the examination.
- Susan will be able to answer the question. Susan will **not** be able to answer the question.
- We shall clean up the place.
- The girls will sing again **tonight**.
- He will write you a letter.
- My sister will be at home **tonight**.

## EXERCISE 70 – SIMPLE FUTURE TENSE

Turn these statements into questions.

e.g. I shall tell them the news tomorrow.  
Shall I **tell** them the news **tomorrow**?

- She will do the work for you. Will she do the work for you?
- You will be there **this evening**. Will you be there **this evening**?
- We shall listen to her story. Shall we listen to her story?
- We shall buy the tickets **tomorrow morning**. Shall we buy the tickets **tomorrow morning**?
- They will remember your name. Will they remember your name?
- Pik Ling will return the book to you. Will Pik Ling return the book to you?
- I shall leave the book here.
- They will win the game **this evening**.
- You will be able to help us.
- We shall sweep the room **later**.

### EXERCISE 71 – 'GOING TO'

Rewrite these sentences using 'going to' instead of 'shall' or 'will'.
