### Who was César Manrique?

César Manrique is a famous artist from Lanzarote, Spain. He was born in 1919 and died in 1992. He was an architect, sculptor, and painter. He created many beautiful works of art and sculptures on the island.

Manrique was passionate about protecting the environment. He worked to keep the island clean and unspoiled. He also designed parks and gardens. He believed that nature should be respected and celebrated.

Manrique created the Jameos del Agua, a unique underground cave with a pool, restaurant, and auditorium, in the north of Lanzarote. He also built the Mirador del Rio, a lookout point with amazing views of the sea.

In 1993, the César Manrique Foundation was established to continue his work. The foundation works to promote and protect the natural beauty of the island. It also promotes art and culture.

Today, tourists come to Lanzarote to see the works of Manrique. They can visit his parks, sculptures, and other works of art. His legacy will live on forever.
