In 1942, Anne Frank, a young writer in Holland, wrote a famous diary.



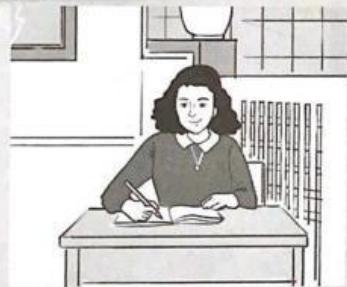
Friday, 12th June

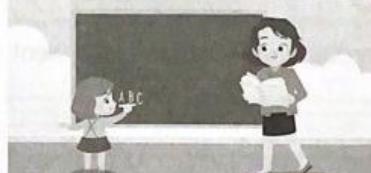

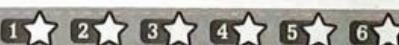
