

## Humans of the sea!

In the past, scientists always believed that chimpanzees were the most intelligent animals in the world. But now many scientists think that dolphins are more intelligent than chimpanzees. They've got large brains – some dolphin brains are bigger than human brains. And, like humans, dolphins have personalities.

It's easy to train dolphins. They learn very quickly, and one dolphin can teach tricks to other dolphins, for example walking on its tail.

Dolphins are very friendly animals. They often swim next to boats. They sometimes help swimmers and surfers in trouble in the sea. When sharks are near, they sometimes swim around the swimmer to protect him or her.

But humans don't often help dolphins! Fishermen kill about 300,000 dolphins and whales by accident every year when they are fishing. Most scientists now think that we should protect dolphins better. They think that we shouldn't put dolphins in zoos. Dolphins are really clever. They're the humans of the sea!
