**A** Most countries are famous for certain types of foods. Mention Italy, and people think of pizza or pasta. Talk about Spain, Japan, or South Korea, and they probably imagine paella, sushi, and kimchi. But what about Canada? What food is it most famous for? Some Canadians would argue that the national dish is poutine, a combination of French fries, gravy, and cheese. Outside of Canada, it is a little-known dish.

**B** Another food associated with Canada is maple syrup - there is even a maple leaf on the Canadian flag. However, it may not be the best choice as a symbol of Canadian food. The syrup comes from a sugar maple tree - one of the three main kinds of syrup-producing maple trees. However, sugar maple trees grow in less than half of Canada's thirteen regions. In fact, many Canadians were not fans of the maple leaf flag when it was first suggested in 1963. Because the trees are not found throughout the country, some Canadians felt they were not a symbol of the whole nation. Some are surprised to learn, too, that syrup-producing maple trees are not only found in Canada; they grow widely in the U.S., for example, and U.S. states like Vermont and Maine produce their own maple syrup.

**C** Whether or not maple syrup is a good symbol of Canada, it's definitely an extremely popular food. In 2016, for instance, total exports of it were worth approximately 360 million



Canadian dollars. One reason for this - probably the main reason, in fact - is its unique taste. Many people like it on pancakes or waffles, but the syrup can be used as an ingredient in many recipes. In fact, in most dishes that require sugar or honey, maple syrup can be used instead. Another reason for the popularity of maple syrup is that it has health benefits. Research shows that it contains special compounds called antioxidants that are also found in berries, tomatoes, green tea, and other so-called "superfoods." These have been shown to help protect our bodies from diseases like cancer and diabetes.
