Finding your dream job

1 Finding the perfect job is a big **challenge**. Getting a job that satisfies you and keeping it can make a big difference to happiness in your whole life. How do you do this? Here are four tips to help you find your dream job.

2 First, before making any **decisions**, you need to look at yourself honestly and think about what you love to do and what you are good at. After, it's time to ask yourself a key question: 'What do I really enjoy doing and what kind of a job can I do that will allow me to do what I enjoy doing?'

3 Instead of having a traditional formal interview, it's better to try to organise informal meetings with possible employers and people in the industry you've identified as a good fit for you and your skills. Find out as much as you can from them about the business, their specific companies, the position you would like and other details about the industry.

4 Once you have found a job, it is very important to give your energy and time to doing your job really, really well. When you do this, one of two things will happen - you might find that this is the right career for you, or you might find that it is not the right career for you and that you need to continue searching. **Either way**, by working hard and doing the best job you can, you will find the answer much quicker.

5 The best thing you can do for yourself is to **select** the kind of work that you love and enjoy. You need to find a job where you can use your natural talents and abilities at a high **level**. You must find a job that inspires you to want to become excellent at what you're doing. Do these things, and you will have a better chance of finding happiness and job satisfaction.
